

2017 Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention Program Summary

Watercraft Inspections and Decontaminations

- **Public Accesses:** Inspections conducted at 8 Vermilion public accesses, 5 Burntside public accesses, 1 Shagawa public access
 - o **2017 Goal:** 17,400 inspections plus 625 decontaminations
 - o **2017 Actual:** 20,008 inspections (15% above goal) plus 594 decontaminations (95% of goal)

Private Accesses: Permission by the DNR was given for a pilot project to expand inspections to private accesses. Inspections were conducted by owners and employees at 10 Vermilion resorts, campgrounds, and marinas.

o **2017 Goal:** 1,800 inspections

2018 Actual: 3,107 inspections (73% above goal)

Collaboration with Other Counties and Jurisdictions

- **Fishing Tournaments:** Collaborated with the DNR, 1854 Treaty Authority and the Vermilion Lake Association to achieve close to a 100% inspection rate at 4 out of 5 tournaments held at Fortune Bay Marina.
- Lake SWCD: Established a shared services agreement with Lake SWCD for NSL inspectors to inspect boats at Fall Lake, Snowbank Lake, and Moose Lake. 1,145 watercraft inspections were complete
